Now is a great time to look at your tree and plan the future growth and shape. Especially once the leaves fall off to reveal the branches and structure. You can sketch a rough outline of how it looks, and determine if a branch needs to be moved, or even removed. You can watch videos, or read books discussing techniques and styles; or you can start looking for a special pot if it is not

in the ideal one. Regardless of what you do, there is always something you can do to improve your tree(s) and or your understanding and knowledge.
